**ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFF’S APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY
RESTRAINING ORDER**

CAME ON to be considered Plaintiff’s Application for Temporary Restraining Order in the above-styled cause. After considering the pleadings, evidence, and arguments of counsel, , the Court finds:

1. Plaintiff will suffer immediate and irreparable harm, injury, and/or loss if this Application is not granted;
2. This harm includes the physical safety of Warren Broadnax, the employees of She’s Happy Hair, Inc., including corporate employees, the store employees working at the stores located at 3280 South Loop West, Houston, Texas, and 11422 Southwest Freeway, Houston, Texas, and 12722 Northwest Freeway, Houston, Texas (collectively referred to herein as “**Houston Stores**”), and the customers of the Houston Stores, as well as the successful and peaceful operations of the Houston Stores, who are entitled to work in a safe environment, free of threats and the violent behavior of Marcus Bowers.
3. It is imperative that the safety of Warren Broadnax, the employees of She’s Happy Hair, Inc., and the customers of the Houston Stores be protected until the legal issues of the

parties are resolved, either through mediation, the granting of a temporary injunction, and/or time of trial.

4. Plaintiff has demonstrated a probable right of relief;
5. Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Plaintiff's Application for Restraining Order is GRANTED; It is further,

a. ORDERED that Defendant, MARCUS BOWERS is enjoined from interfering with the daily business operations of She's Happy Hair, Inc., including appearing at store locations, including the parking lots, and surrounding area, at 3280 South Loop West, Houston, Texas, 11422 Southwest Freeway, Houston, Texas, and 12722 Northwest Freeway, Houston, Texas.

b. ORDERED that the bond for this Temporary Restraining Order is \$50.00. The Court finds that such amount is adequate to protect the parties so enjoined, and given that a previous bond has been paid.

This Order expires at _____ am/pm on January ____, 2026, unless extended or superseded by an order granting temporary injunction.

The court sets a Temporary Injunction hearing for January ____, 2026.
