On Saturday, April 25, 2026, at approximately 1743 hours I, Officer Deuley #7149, while on a theft call at the mall (500 Southpark Center), was advised of an active "Shots Fired" call at Costco (166 90 Royalton Rd). I promptly activated the overhead lights and sirens of my marked patrol vehicle (# 19) and proceeded in emergency response to the call.

As I approached, I followed Officer Tylor Tohati #7156, as we were waved down by multiple bystanders towards the scene of the incident. They guided us towards the front (main entrance) of the store, nearest the east garage entrance doors. As we pulled up, I saw several individuals on their knees, attempting to render medical aid to the victim, Mr. Randolph Corrigan. The good Samaritans asked for assistance as we exited the cruiser. Due to several shopping carts being within my view, I was unable to see Mr. Corrigan until I was standing directly over top of him. He was laying on his back, face up, with a large pool of blood collecting underneath him. One Samaratin had a pair of work gloves on and was applying pressure to his right-side chest, identifying this to be one of the areas where the victim was shot.

Based on prior radio traffic, alluding to the possibility of the shooter, later identified as Mr. Christian Bryant, fleeing the scene, I continued to render aid anticipating the scene to be safe. As I was doing so, Officer Tohati had recognized a firearm on the ground, next to Mr. Bryant, who repeatedly stated that Mr. Corrigan had a knife. Officer Tohati had went back to his cruiser and had secured the firearm as I requested for him to retrieve me a medical kit. Officer Tohati returned with a medical kit, then escorted Mr. Bryant back to his vehicle.

At this time, Officer Derek Smith #7115, had arrived and assisted in rendering aid. As we began to cut more of Mr. Corrigan's clothing back, it revealed several more gunshot wounds to his chest, abdomen, and right arm. Several chest seals were applied to Mr. Corrigan's wounds, which on scene we could recognize there to be approximately 7-8 total wounds. Officer Tohati had assisted in placing a tourniquet to Mr. Corrigan's arm as well. Shortly thereafter, Strongsville Medic #2 arrived on scene and took over medical applications. Throughout the duration of the incident, Mr. Corrigan was breathing and conscious. Though he was able to answer questions, is was apparent his alertness was beginning to decline. He was there by transported by Medic #2 to Metro Hospital.

Following the incident, I assisted by handing out statement forms to several different witnesses on scene. I then was instructed by Sergeant Jeffrey Benedictis #7132, to go to Metro Health and remain with Mr. Corrigan.

I arrived at Metro Health at approximately 1813 hours. Here, I stood by as hospital staff continued to work on Mr. Corrigan. Mr. Corrigan was later pronounced deceased at 1845 hours by Dr. Justin

Dvorak. Metro Health provided Mr. Corrigan's clothing items, wallet, and phone into separate bags.

These items were returned to SPD and later logged into evidence. This is a case that is currently under investigation by the Strongsville Police Detective Bureau.
